







Research fellowship on "Indicators of pastoral mobility in the late prehistoric Southern Caucasus: analysis and evaluation of the archaeozoological finds from the excavations of Ca' Foscari University in Georgia" – Department of Humanities Ca' Foscari University of Venice

Description

The Department of Humanities at Ca' Foscari University of Venice (Dipartimento di Studi Umanistici dell'Università Ca' Foscari Venezia) invites applications for a fellowship in: "Indicators of pastoral mobility in the late prehistoric Southern Caucasus: analysis and evaluation of the archaeozoological finds from the excavations of Ca' Foscari University in Georgia", Academic disciplines: L-ANT/10 Methods of archaeological research - L-ANT/01 Prehistory and early history - L-OR/05 Ancient Near East archaeology and art history, duration 18 months, tutor Prof. Elena ROVA, financed by the PRIN 2022 - Missione 4 "Istruzione e Ricerca" del Piano Nazionale di Ripresa e Resilienza ed in particolare la componente C2 – investimento 1.1, Fondo per il Programma Nazionale di Ricerca e Progetti di Rilevante Interesse Nazionale (PRIN"20227JXEB2 - EStimating PREhistoric MObility in the mountainous regions of the Near East: animal management, raw materials procurement, technology and settlement patterns as indicators of movement and interconnections", CUP: H53D23000070006, Principal Investigator Prof. Elena ROVA.

Abstract: The grantee will complete the (for the most part already accomplished) analysis and will proceed to the general interpretation of the archaeozoological data collected by the Ca' Foscari archaeological expeditions in Georgia in 2009-2023 (Natsargora, Aradetis Orgora/Doghlauri, Tsiteli Gorebi 5, Tchiauri 1 e 2 sites, chronological range Early Chalcolithic-Iron Age). He/she is expected to contextualise the data from the functional, chronological and geographical points of view, will collaborate with the other members of the research team in evaluating the results of the already carried out analyses and in choosing to perform further analyses on the materials. He/she will evaluate the results obtained in the light of other published archaeozoological corpora from sites of the Southern Caucasus and Eastern Anatolia, with the special aim to reconstruct variability and development in the course of time of the pastoral mobility patterns in the region.

The fellowship is intended to provide the successful candidate with the opportunity to pursue his/her own research while benefiting from the range of expertise at Ca' Foscari University of Venice.

Who can apply

Prospective candidates are expected to hold a master's degree in Archaeology or Biology and a suitable scientific / professional track record.

Ca' Foscari encourages applications from researchers with positive evaluation in all the criteria in individual proposals such as Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar.

Researchers having successfully completed Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar funded projects are warmly encouraged to apply.

Duration of contract: 18 months (approximate starting date: 1st March 2024)

Stipend: The research fellowship amounts to 29,050.50 Euros, including taxes and social charges.

Deadline for submission of applications: 16th December 2023, h. 12.00 noon (Italian time).

The candidate, after the uploading, will receive a submission number and an e-mail acknowledging receipt of his/her application.

The candidate if necessary could access the procedures for updating any data and materials by the link provided by the e-mail, in any case any updates must be made no later than the deadline on **16**th **December 2023**, **h. 12.00 noon (Italian time)**.

Evaluation

Up to 100 points, specifically: For qualifications, publications and possible tests, from 0 to 60; For interview, from 0 to 40.

The following qualifications are considered as evaluation criteria:

- a) a PhD, or the completion of a PhD course pending graduation with dissertation in Archaeozoology;
- b) list of publications;









- specialization diplomas and attendance certificates at post-graduate specialization courses, obtained both in Italy or abroad, documented research activity in public and private organizations with contracts, study grants or assignments both in Italy and abroad in the field of archaeozoology;
- d) Familiarity with the archaeology (in particular of the pre- and protohistorical periods) of the Southern Caucasus;
- e) Partecipation as archaeozoologist to excavations and archaeological research.
- f) attached 'preferential securities', if the candidate possesses them see Article 5 of the competition available in Italian (link);
- g) any other element provided for the announcement, to the articles 2, 3 and 5 of the competition available in Italian (link).

The interview aims to assess the candidates' skills and expertise on the following subjects:

- Knowledge of the theory and methods of archaeozoology;
- General knowledge of the principles of archaeological stratigraphy, ability to interpret excavation data:
- Ability to carry out independent archaeozoological research;
- Knowledge of the problems of the archaeology of the region under study.

At the end of his/her research activity, the research fellow is required to provide the Department with:

- Final report about the archeozoological assemblages of the sites of Natsargora, Aradetis Orgora/Doghlauri, Tsiteli Gorebi 5, Tchiauri 1 and 2, with tables of frequency, distribution etc. (to be delivered by the end of the project)
- · at least one communication at an international congress about the results of the research
- a draft article for an international journal, (to be delivered maximum six months after the end of the PRIN project)

Selection procedure
