		Selected students must be officially nominated by the International Office of their home institution by sending an email			

Selected students must be officially nominated by the International Office of their home institution by sending an email to the Departments (contact emails below). Nominations made by students themselves won't be accepted. Nomination must include the following information:

- Last name
- First name
- Date of birth
- · Email address
- Field of study
- Current level of study
- Level of study during mobility
- Starting semester (1st or 2nd)
- Length of study (one or two semesters)
- Department being nominated for (see list below)



STEP 2: ONLINE APPLICATION

Once nominated, students will receive an "Application Kit" with the following items:

- Guidelines (MoveOn platform application link, instructions)
- Learning agreement templates (Erasmus and non-Erasmus)
- Agenda and mobility contacts

All the application process is digital. Students must submit their MoveOn application form with all required documents online by the deadline indicated above.

Students will have to include in their application a learning agreement approved by their academic contact at UP Cité.

Students must indicate a valid e-mail address in the form (avoid Hotmail, live, qq.com and 163.com accounts).

STEP 3: MOBILITY PREPARATION

If accepted, students will receive by the end of June a "Welcome Kit" with the following items:

- A Welcome Guide with the different administrative paths to follow
- An acceptance letter
- Information about the *Welcome Webinars* (life in Paris, university registration, housing, health...): between June and July for arrivals in the first semester, early December for arrivals in the second semester.
- Information about the *Welcome Week*: mid-September for arrivals in the first semester, mid-January for arrivals in the second semester

We remind you that students have to respect the field of study and the department (UFR) indicated in the learning agreement. All course enrolments are subject to availability numbers.

Level of studies:

First cycle = undergraduate level = bachelor in French higher education (3 years)Second cycle = postgraduate level = master in French higher education (2 years)

Third cycle = doctorate level = doctorate in French higher education (minimum of 3

years)

GRADING SCALE

The grading system in France is based on a numbered scale from 0 to 20, with 20 as the highest possible grade. 10 is the minimum passing grade. If a student does not receive a passing grade, they will have to pass retake exams (rattrapage).

LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

Students must have language proficiency and they need proof of language proficiency for the language of studies at UP Cité, except for native speaker students.

CERTIFICATION

A **B2** level (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages: CEFRL) is required.

The following certifications are accepted:

- DELF B2
- DALF C1 and C2
- TCF
- Certificate issued by the Language Resource Center of the home university
- Certificate issued by a French teacher from the home university
- Native speaker proof

ENGLISH LANGUAGE

LEVEL

CERTIFICATION

A **B2 level** (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages: CEFRL) is required.

The following certifications are accepted:

- IELTS (at least 5.5)
- TOEFL (at least 90)
- TOEIC
- Certificate issued by the Language Resource Center of the home university
- Certificate issued by an English teacher from the home university
- Native speaker proof

IMPORTANT: The recommended level of language varies depending on the course and the language in which it is delivered. For information, we recommend at least B2 English for English-taught lectures and B2 French for French-taught lectures. Student's language level must be approved by the academic contact of Université Paris Cité before registering to a specific course.

FRENCH AS A FOREIGN LANGUAGE LESSONS

French as a foreign language (FLE) classes are available throughout the year at:

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4. GENERAL INFORMATION

Housing

UNIVERSITY STUDENT HOUSING

Université Paris Cité only has a few rooms in several residences in Paris (also called CROUS). Therefore, we cannot guarantee housing for all students.

Accommodations in CROUS residences are equipped with a kitchenette, bathroom facilities and internet access. All students staying at a CROUS residence will be eligible for financial housing aid provided by the French State.

While applying after their nomination, students will have the option to ask for accommodation provided by UP Cité. A commission will review the applications and decide about housing placements (by the end of June for the 1 *semester/by December for the 2 **red semester). A housing form will be sent to selected students and will have to be submitted by the deadline to confirm housing.

Note that it is very difficult for exchange students to get a part-time job. It is important that students have enough funding to cover the expected cost of their stay in Paris

Rent (€): around €800/month for a studio apartment, around €600/month for a shared flat. These prices apply in Paris, suburban tend to be cheaper.

Transport fares (€): €86.40/month for Paris.

N.B. Students under 26 can benefit from a discount pass ("Imagin'R") for €38/month.

Food (€): €250/month

Social security (health care system)

HEALTH INSURANCE

International students have access to the French national healthcare system.

A complementary insurance is highly recommended.
