Description

The Department of Humanities at Ca' Foscari University of Venice (Dipartimento di Studi Umanistici dell'Università Ca' Foscari Venezia) invites applications for a fellowship in: **“The correspondence of the apostolic nuncios Commendone and Graziani – data extraction from historical sources and their treatment through OMEKA S”**, Academic discipline: M-STO/08 Archival science, bibliography and librarianship, Tutor prof. Dorit Raines, within the PRIN 2017 entitled “The Nuncio's Secret Archives: Papal Diplomacy and European Multi-denominational Societies Before the Thirty Years War”, CUP: H74117000190003.

The research may be carried out in English.

The fellowship is intended to provide the successful candidate with the opportunity to pursue his/her own research while benefiting from the range of expertise at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia.

Abstract

Through a pioneering approach integrating Digital Humanities and traditional research, the project aims to reorganize for the first time an extraordinary private archive, now divided between Italy and Kansas, decisive for reconstructing the history of papal diplomacy in the crucial period between the peace of Augsburg (1555) and the Thirty Years War. The archive, created by two of the most high-ranking diplomats of the late 16th century, G.F. Commendone and A.M. Graziani, will be valorized through the portal Graziani Archives, which, in addition to providing a reference model for the interrogation and study of private political archives of modern age, will give access to unpublished documentation, mostly informal and very different from the official and already known one, describing with unprecedented richness and depth the vast networks activated by papal diplomats, their relationship with the regular orders and the clash between papacy and multi-confessional space.

The research will focus on the Graziani archives and on the diplomatic relations that linked him to the Italian and European scenario. In particular, the research program envisages the study, inventory and regesta of the main correspondences of Graziani, for which a proven experience in working with correspondence and correspondence materials of the early modern age is required. The candidate will be required to ingest the relevant metadata through the use of the Omeka S software, knowledge of which is required.

Who can apply

Prospective candidates are expected to hold a PhD and appropriate scientific-professional curriculum for the research.

Ca' Foscari encourages applications from researchers with positive evaluation in all the criteria in individual proposals such as Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar. Researchers having successfully completed Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar funded projects are warmly encouraged to apply.

Evaluation

Up to 100 points, specifically:

- For qualifications, publications and possible tests, from 0 to 60;
- For the interview, from 0 to 40.

Candidates are admitted to the interview if assessment of the qualifications and the possible tests results in a score equal to or greater than 42/60.

The following qualifications are considered as evaluation criteria:

- a) a list of the candidate's scientific publications, in particular early-modern history, critical editions or

research based on early-modern documentation;

b) the performance of documented research activity in public and private organizations with post-doctoral fellowships, contracts, study grants or assignments both in Italy and abroad;

c) attached 'preferential securities', if the candidate possesses them - see Article 5;

d) any other element provided for the announcement, to the articles 2, 3 and 5.

The interview aims to assess the candidates' skills and expertise on the following subjects:

- Knowledge of the early-modern documentary sources
- Ability to examine sources adequately, with particular reference to epistolary materials
- Knowledge of the Omeka S application
- Knowledge of the basic requirements of metadating the contents of historical materials in a digital environment
- English language
- Italian language proficiency (for foreign applicants).

At the end of his/her research activity, the research fellow is required to provide the Department with:

- Data entry in OMEKA S of data related to the project "The nuncio's secret archives"
- Scientific papers
- Dissemination to peer and general public.
