Description

The Department of Humanities at Ca' Foscari University of Venice (Dipartimento di Studi Umanistici dell'Università Ca' Foscari Venezia) invites applications for a fellowship in: "Critical Edition and Commentary of Michele Della Vedova's 'Lamento di Costantinopoli'", Academic discipline: L-FIL-LET/13 Philology of Italian literature, tutor prof. Cristiano Lorenzi, financed by the PRIN 2020 project "VIS-Venetian Integrated Studies. Philology, Textuality, Lexicography (XIVth-XVIIIth centuries)" (Prot. 20205LFEJ9)", CUP H73C20000050001.

The fellowship is intended to provide the successful candidate with the opportunity to pursue his/her own research while benefiting from the range of expertise at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia.

Abstract

The research fellow will prepare a critical edition and historical and linguistic study of *the Lamento per la caduta di Costantinopoli* by Michele della Vedova da Pola (ca. 1454), already published on the basis of three incomplete codices by Antonio Medin and Ludovico Frati in 1888, but in need of a substantial textual restoration on the basis of other six testimonials that have been indicated by Armando Balduino in 1980 and Anna Cornagliotti in 2007. The research fellow will also be asked to edit approximately 50 entries for the VEV (*Vocabolario storico-etimologico del Veneziano*), directed by Luca D'Onghia and Lorenzo Tomasin.

Who can apply

Prospective candidates are expected to hold:

- Ph.D. in Italian studies and appropriate academic and professional CV.

Ca' Foscari encourages applications from researchers with positive evaluation in all the criteria in individual proposals such as Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar. Evaluation

Up to 100 points, specifically:

Candidates are admitted to the interview if assessment of the qualifications and the possible tests results in a score equal to or greater than 42/60.

The following qualifications are considered as evaluation criteria:

- a) a list of the candidate's scientific publications;
- b) attendance certificates (or diplomas) of post-graduate specialization courses, obtained both in Italy and abroad;
- c) documented research activities related to the purpose of the call with contracts, scholarships or research fellowships in public and private entities both in Italy and abroad;
- d) experience of critical edition and commentary of Medieval and Renaissance vulgar texts, particularly of Northern Italy;
- e) attached 'preferential securities', if the candidate possesses them see Article 5 of the competition available in Italian (link);
- f) any other element provided for the announcement, to the articles 2, 3 and 5 of the competition available in Italian (link).
