Description

The Department of Philosophy and Cultural Heritage at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia invites applications for a fellowship in:

Title: "Environmental ethics and animal ethics. Critical analysis of the differences of perspective and of the points of convergence"

duration 12 months

abstract: This project has the following objectives: to reconstruct the origins of environmental ethics and animal ethics, to compare the various models, to analyze some case studies.

The first part of the research work will serve to outline the origins of environmental ethics and animal ethics, starting with the pioneering work of Aldo Leopold (A Sand County Almanac, 1949). In this context, particular attention will be paid to the powerful development that these two fields of applied ethics have undergone since the 1970s, with the publication of the following works: The Shallow and the Deep, Long Range Ecology Movement: A Summary, by the Norwegian philosopher Arne Naess in 1973; Animal Liberation, published in 1973 by the Australian philosopher Peter Singer; Man's responsibility for nature: ecological problems and western traditions, published in 1974 by the Australian philosopher John Passmore; The Imperative of Responsibility, published by the German philosopher Hans Jonas in 1979.

The second part will be dedicated to the critical comparison between different models and perspectives, with particular attention to the contemporary debate.

The third part of the work will be dedicated to practical applications, also in the light of the recent constitutional amendment of articles 9 and 41 of the Constitution which poses interpretative problems strictly linked to the different ethical perspectives analyzed in the second part.

The research may be carried out in English.

The fellowship is intended to provide the successful candidate with the opportunity to pursue his/her own research while benefiting from the range of expertise at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia.

Who can apply

Prospective candidates are expected to hold doctoral degree in Philosophy.

Ca' Foscari encourages applications from researchers with positive evaluation in all the criteria in individual proposals such as Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting

Researchers having successfully completed Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar funded projects are warmly encouraged to apply.

Duration of contract: 12 months (approximately starting: January 1st, 2023)

Stipend: The research fellowship amounts to **19.367 Euros** per year, including taxes and social charges.

Candidates should submit:

- (If available) Details of Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions Individual Fellowships, ERC Starting Grants, FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/ SIR Scientific Young Independence Research funded projects;
- 6. Declaration on availability to held the interview in remote;
- 7. A list of the candidate's scientific publications in the field of ethics. The publications' files, maximum 2, have to be attached by the on line submission procedure;
- 8. All documents, qualifications and publications relevant for the selection procedure (please, see the notice <u>link</u>).
