### **Description**

The CESA Center at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia, in charge of the administrative management of the above mentioned project, invites applications for a fellowship in:

# Abstract:

The research project tackles: (a) positioning and re-positioning narratives and images of destinations in contemporary trans-media tourism discourses and (b) conceptualization, design, and creation of novel communications strategies for destinations. The researcher is expected to investigate several aspects concerning tourism and corporate businesses, such as:

Analyses and discussions of the forms of narration (literary, cinematographic, audiovisual, and those throughout social media) that have been most commonly utilized in recent years, in relation to their socio-economic contexts, and their ongoing transformations due to critical social change, such as unsustainable over-tourism or climate change.

New forms of storytelling regarding spaces that overcome stereotypes, including narratological ones, that convey authenticity and reflect on themes such as empathy, estrangement, awe;

Hypotheses of present trends and future scenarios, that derive from literature and other art forms, to comprehend the characteristics of the user of these narrations in relation to his or her possible expectations.

The researcher will be responsible for (a) a research based on these lines of inquiry with a particular but not exclusive focus on the city of Venice and the Veneto region in Italy, and (b) will also support the tutor in creating a cultural observatory oriented towards business and tourism, in order to collect the most significant research applicable in these areas, which also originate from other art-historical disciplines and more generally each of the humanities, inside and outside the Spoke, promoting dialogue between the business world and the research world.

Deliverables will include:

The organization of cultural observatory to collect research and communication experiences in areas related to tourism (art, archaeology, cinema, literature, new media...), from the business world and the research world. (months 1-6);

A research paper outlining the state of art of the forms of narration in recent years (point 1 of the list, months 1 to 6):

A report on the newest form of storytelling (point 2 of the list, months 6 to 18);

A report on present trends and future scenarios (point 3 of the list, months 6 to 18);

Participation in meetings and workshops on research topics (months 6 to 24);

A publication on research topics (months 18 to 24).

The fellowship is intended to provide the successful candidate with the opportunity to pursue his/her own research while benefiting from the range of expertise at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia.

### Who can apply

Prospective candidates are expected to hold a PhD in Italianistics with a focus on the contemporary field and a professional scientific curriculum suitable for carrying out research activities.

Ca' Foscari encourages applications from researchers with positive evaluation in all the criteria in individual proposals such as Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar. Researchers having successfully completed Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence









Research) or similar funded projects are warmly encouraged to apply.

The following are considered preferential qualifications:

a - specialization diplomas and certificates of attendance at postgraduate specialization courses, obtained both in Italy and abroad, the performance of documented research activities carried out with public and private entities both in Italy and abroad;

b - other titles: scientific publications, invited talks, oral talks and posters at international conferences, patents, other dissemination activities, involvement in research projects, awards; have worked in the academic field in projects with companies, in particular related to storytelling and storytelling; have received research grants or research grants; have an excellent knowledge of the certified English language; have publications on the latest digital media.

Duration of contract: twenty-four months (approximately starting: in February 2023)

Stipend: The research fellowship amounts to 21.401,93 Euros, including taxes and social charges

Deadline for submission of applications: January 09, 2023, 12.00 noon CET.

Candidates must submit:

#### **Evaluation**

Up to 100 points, specifically:

For qualifications and publications, from 0 up to 60 points (42 points is the minimum score for admission to the interview)

For the interview, from 0 up to 40 points (28 point is the minimum score for passing the interview)

# Selection procedure

## Interviews will take place online on January 19, 2023, at 5.00 PM CET.

The list of candidates admitted to the interview together with notice of any postponements, or changes in the time of the interview, will be announced on **January 12**, **2023** by means of a notice that will be published at the following <u>link</u>. It is the candidate's responsibility to check the admission results and, if admitted, to show up at the required date and time.

The interview aims to ascertain expertise on the following topics:

- social analysis of the present emerging from literature and other arts;
- main techniques and tools of storytelling and storytelling;
- narratives about Venice and Veneto in contemporary times
- main characteristics of the Venetian territorial context, especially in relation to its main artistic-literary expressions
