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**Research fellowship on “Digital mapping of lemmas from the Atticist lexica Eclogue, Praeparatio sophistica, Antiatticist, Moeris”, tutor prof. Olga Tribulato, Ca' Foscari University of Venice (Italian law 30 December 2010, n. 240, art. 22)**

### Description

The Department of Humanities at Ca' Foscari University of Venice (Dipartimento di Studi Umanistici dell'Università Ca' Foscari Venezia) invites applications for a fellowship in: “**Digital mapping of lemmas from the Atticist lexica Eclogue, Praeparatio sophistica, Antiatticist, Moeris**”, Academic discipline: L-FIL-LET/02 Greek language and literature, Tutor prof. Olga Tribulato, within the FARE Project entitled “Digital Encyclopedia of Atticism: Creating a New Digital Tool for the Study of Greek Lexicography, CUP: H73C20000150001.

The fellowship is intended to provide the successful candidate with the opportunity to pursue his/her own research while benefiting from the range of expertise at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia.

### Abstract

The post-doc (a scholar in Ancient Greek with expertise in ancient erudition and the transmission of Attic literary texts) will be in charge of significantly augmenting the corpus of lexicographic articles of the Digital Encyclopedia of Atticism ([www.atticism.eu](http://www.atticism.eu)) of the ERC PURA project, and of improving its digital interoperability, in collaboration with the VeDPH and the IT experts in charge of it. The concrete objective will be to create a complete digital mapping of the lemmas of four lexica (Eclogue, Praeparatio Sophistica, Antiatticist, Moeris) consisting in lexicographic articles identical to parts A, B, C of those already published in DEA (therefore without the linguistic commentary – minimum target 300 articles). The second objective will be the production of some ‘expanded’ lexicographic articles, inclusive of the linguistic and philological commentary (minimum target 25: eventually to be changed according to the development of the research). The research fellow will also organise and lead an outreach project for schools on to the application of digital tools to ancient texts and using DEA as a case study.

### Who can apply

Prospective candidates are expected to hold:

- Ph.D. in Classics with a focus on language, literature and philology and appropriate academic and professional CV.

Ca' Foscari encourages applications from researchers with positive evaluation in all the criteria in individual proposals such as Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar.

Researchers having successfully completed Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar funded projects are warmly encouraged to apply.

**Duration of contract:** 36 months (approximate starting date: 1<sup>st</sup> March 2023).

**Stipend:** The research fellowship total amount is **70.530,00 Euros**, including taxes and social charges.

**Deadline for submission of applications:** 20<sup>th</sup> January 2023, h. 12.00 noon (Italian time)



### How to apply

Candidates should submit:

1. The application form;
2. A motivation letter (max 1 page) along with their CV in European format, duly dated and signed, both to enclosed as a one single.pdf file ([link](#));
3. A copy of a valid identity document (either Identity Card or Passport);
4. (If available) Evaluation Summary Reports of Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) individual proposals having passed all the evaluation thresholds;
5. (If available) Details of Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships, ERC Starting Grants, FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/ SIR Scientific Young Independence Research funded projects;

The candidate, after the uploading, will receive a submission number and an e-mail acknowledging receipt of his/her application.

The candidate if necessary could access the procedures for updating any data and materials by the link provided by the e-mail, in any case any updates must be made no later than the deadline **20<sup>th</sup> January 2023, h. 12.00 noon (Italian time)**.

Please note that the University can be contacted for any support needs by the candidate by 19<sup>h</sup> January 2023, h. 1.00 p.m. (Italian time).

Please note that in case of an high number of applications and / or weight of the materials loaded by the candidates the system might become slower, Therefore it is suggested not to start the process close to the deadline.

**NB:** The University does not take on responsibility for wrong or late communication of addresses, nor for any communication problem not depending on the University.

### Evaluation

Up to 100 points, specifically:

- For qualifications, publications and possible tests, from 0 to 60;
- For the interview, from 0 to 40.

Candidates are admitted to the interview if assessment of the qualifications and the possible tests results in a score equal to or greater than 42/60.

The following qualifications are considered as evaluation criteria:

- a) a list of the candidate's scientific publications;
- b) electronic submission of a maximum of 8 publications (in PDF format);
- c) specialisation diplomas and attendance certificates at post-graduate specialisation courses, obtained both



in Italy or abroad;

d) documented research activity in public and private organisations with contracts, study grants, research fellowships, ect., both in Italy and abroad, especially in the following fields: (1) history and transmission of Greek scholarship, particularly of the Atticist kind; (2) language and transmission of Attic literary texts, particularly in Atticist lexicography;

e) attached 'preferential securities', if the candidate possesses them - see Article 5 of the competition available in Italian ([link](#));

f) any other element provided for the announcement, to the articles 2, 3 and 5 of the competition available in Italian ([link](#)).

The interview aims to assess the candidates' skills and expertise on the following subjects:

- excellent knowledge of the history of Greek philology and erudition, with particular attention to Atticist lexicography;
- excellent knowledge of the language and the transmission of Attic literary texts, in particular in relation to their reception in lexicography;
- knowledge of the structure and contents of DEA ([www.atticism.eu](http://www.atticism.eu)) and their eventual experience in Digital Humanities;
- knowledge of English language.

The interview will be held in Italian or, for foreign candidates, in English.

At the end of his/her research activity, the research fellow is required to provide the Department with:

- A minimum of 300 lexicographic articles, modelled on parts A, B, C (including English translation) of current DEA articles, and aiming – as far as possible – at a complete mapping of the contents of the lexica Eclogue, Praeparatio Sophistica, Antiatticist, Moeris lexicons.
- A minimum of 25 'expanded' lexicographic articles including linguistic and philological commentary (parts D–F of DEA entries).
- Design and organization of an outreach project for high schools dedicated to the application of digital tools to ancient texts, starting from DEA as a case study.
