Research fellowship on: The discipline of the so-called "historic shops" among heritage conservation needs intangible cultural heritage and protection of the prerogatives of private individuals - Università Ca' Foscari Venezia

Description

The Department of Philosophy and Cultural Heritage at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia invites applications for a fellowship in:

Title: The discipline of the so-called "historic shops" among heritage conservation needs intangible cultural heritage and protection of the prerogatives of private individuals.

SSD: lus 10 - Administrative law

Scientific responsible: Prof. Marco Olivi

Abstract: The elaboration of the category of "intangible cultural heritage", the studies and the discipline national and international that have helped to outline this category, have brought to light the need, on the one hand, to clarify which assets can be traced back to it and, on the other hand, to introduce appropriate tools for the protection of such assets. It is in this context that the theme of the protection of the so-called "historic shops", i.e. those commercial activities which, for historical reasons, cultural and social heritage are considered part of the intangible cultural heritage and for such reasons considered in themselves worthy of protection. The need to introduce a form of protection for these activities has, however, raised numerous critical issues, also in consideration of the fact that it does not appear find adequate support in the current legislation. Thanks above all to the arrests of the jurisprudence, the thesis of the so-called Interpenetration between property and activity", second which, although it is not legitimate to introduce a specific protection bond in favor of the activity exercised by the "historic shop", it is nonetheless possible to hypothesize a protection of the property in which this activity is carried out, on the assumption that the former is valued - and it is precisely for this reason considered in itself worthy of cultural protection – by the presence of the second.

However, the elaboration of the thesis referred to above did not resolve the critical issues related to the issue referred to question, raising questions not only of an applicative nature, but also of a systematic nature appear to be worthy of in-depth scrutiny. The topic being researched, relevant to the situation in which all the historic centers of the Italian municipalities are located, it is even more so for the historic center of Venice.

The research may be carried out in English.

The fellowship is intended to provide the successful candidate with the opportunity to pursue his/her own research while benefiting from the range of expertise at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia.

Prospective candidates are expected to hold a doctoral degree in legal subjects, or related disciplines.

Evaluation

Up to 100 points, specifically: For qualifications, publications and possible tests, from 0 to 60; For interview, from 0 to 40.
