Research fellowship on "A retrospective analysis of the mobilisation of cultural actors for a new tourist attraction: The modern Venetian Carnival" - Università Ca' Foscari Venezia (Italian law 30 December 2010, n. 240, art. 22 and subsequent amendments and additions).

Description

The Department of Management at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia invites application for one-year fellowship in A retrospective analysis of the mobilisation of cultural actors for a new tourist attraction: The modern Venetian Carnival, under the supervision of prof. Giovanni Favero (SSD SECS-P/12 – Economic History)

Project acronym: PRIN 2022 "What went wrong? A retrospective analysis of destination policies in overtouristed hotspots" n. 2022B7RP3P – CUP H53D23000150006.

Abstract: In the last decade, "overtourism", identified as an unbearable massification of tourism concentrated on some "hotspots", has emerged as urgent in the debate on tourist policies.

What made this evolution of tourism, and its side effects, happen in some places rather than in others? A detailed analysis of the role of specific destination policies capturing the interest of the global tourist industry and a retrospective study of political discussions on tourism is essential to understand which interpretive frames underpinned specific measures and actions.

Venice is the most renown city suffering from tourism overflow and monoculture. Its history as a tourist destination marks a turn in 1980 with the sudden and sustained expansion of Winter tourism as a reply to the seasonal volatility of tourist flows. The research fellow will perform an in-depth study of archival and bibliographic materials focusing on the cultural mobilisation for the reinvention of the Venetian Carnival.

The research may be carried out in Italian and English.

The fellowship is intended to provide the successful candidate with the opportunity to pursue his/her own research while benefiting from the range of expertise at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia.

Who can apply

Prospective candidates are expected to hold a doctoral degree in History, History of the Arts and related subject areas and scientific-professional curriculum suitable to the development of research activities related to the fellowship.

Ca' Foscari encourages applications from researchers with positive evaluation in all the criteria in individual proposals such as Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar.

Researchers having successfully completed Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar funded projects are warmly encouraged to apply.

Duration of contract: 12 months (approximately starting: December 2023), with the possibility of renewal within the limits of art. 2 of the Regulations on university research fellowship awarding, which will be subject to a specific contract.

Stipend: The research fellowship amounts to **19.456,00** *Euros* **per year**, including taxes and social charges depending on applicant's filing status (cost to Ca' Foscari € 24.000,00).

Deadline for submission of applications: November 27th 2023, 12 noon (Italian time).

How to apply:



Candidates shall submit:

- 1. The application form;

A motivation letter (max 1 page) along with their CV in European format, duly dated and signed, both to enclosed as a one single.pdf file (<u>link</u>); a declaration must be appended in the footnote of the curriculum, pursuant to the Italian DPR 445/2000 and subsequent amendments and additions, that the information provided corresponds to the truth. Moreover the candidates have to consent to the use of their personal data for the purposes of this selection procedure pursuant to the Italian Legislative Decree 196/2003 and to the EU Regulations 2016/679;
