Research fellowship "Enhancing Craft Ecosystems through a Managerial Approach in European Networks" Project acronym: HEPHAESTUS Heritage in EuroPe: new techHologies in crAft for prEserving and innovaTing fUtureS - CUP H73C22001530006 - Università Ca' Foscari Venezia (Italian law 30 December 2010, n.240, art. 22).

Description

The Venice School of Management at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia invites application for one 26-month fellowship in "Enhancing Craft Ecosystems through a Managerial Approach in European Networks", Project n. 101095123 — HORIZON-CL2-2022-HERITAGE-01, CUP H73C22001530006 under the supervision of prof. Fabrizio Panozzo - SSD ECON-06/A (Business Administration, Accounting & Performance Measurement.

Reference to project Work Packages: WP1, WP2, WP3, WP4, WP 5, WP6, WP7. A full copy of the approved project will be provided to the selected applicant.

Abstract: As part of the Horizon Project "Hephaestus," the research fellow will be tasked with activities including networking, dissemination of research results, mentoring of craft businesses, and project management. The role requires organisational and relational skills to transfer the project results to beneficiaries, promotesustainable business models, transmit craftsmanship knowledge and values to younger generations and society, and foster interaction with policymakers, citizens, and local communities. The research fellow will be required to operate with a distinctively managerial approach that integrates cultural, social, and economic objectives with the competitiveness needs of artisanal enterprises. They must ensure the coherence and effectiveness of activities, with particular attention to enhancing traditional craft skills and implementing sustainable management practices. Furthermore, the research fellow will be responsible for building and strengthening collaboration networks in the craft sector as a creative industry, both at the regional level—by expanding the stakeholders included in the ecosystem of Venetian and Veneto craftsmanship—and at the European level by supporting the creation and consolidation of the meta-project "Crafton." This initiative aims to systematise various European projects dedicated to craftsmanship.

Specific Objectives

- 1. **Development and Coordination of Strategic Relationships**. Strengthen collaborations with craft enterprises and involved stakeholders, expanding the network and promoting the craft ecosystem as a driver of innovation and sustainability.
- 2. **Promotion of Craft Mentoring.** Design and implement integrated mentoring programs that enhance the transfer of knowledge and skills in craftsmanship to younger generations while maintaining a consistent dialogue with other project activities.
- 3. **European Networking.** Consolidate connections with other Horizon projects and European initiatives, contributing to the project's strategic positioning within craftsmanship and sustainable tourism.
- 4. **Communication and Dissemination of Results**. Lead the development and implementation of an integrated communication strategy to promote project results and engage stakeholders through innovative, high-impact content.
- 5. **Evaluation of Business Models and Sustainability**. Monitor the effectiveness of proposed business models, ensuring replicability and sustainability of activities for beneficiary craft enterprises.
- 6. **Contribution to the Craftour Meta-Initiative**. Coordinate project activities within Craftour, strengthening operational synergies and highlighting the role of craftsmanship as a cultural heritage and an innovative sector.

Activity Outputs

- 1. **Strategic Networking Report**. A document detailing developed collaborations, new companies involved, and synergies created with other European projects, highlighting the role of mentoring activities and their operational impact.
- 2. **Mentoring Program.** A structured guide describing objectives, methodologies, and activities to integrate mentoring with transferring craftsmanship skills and technological innovations.



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- 3. **Integrated Communication Plan**. A document outlining innovative strategies and tools to promote project results through "Craft Histories," targeting local, national, and European stakeholders.
- 4. **Operational Policy Briefs**. Concise recommendations based on project outcomes, aimed at influencing public policies and supporting craft enterprises.
- 5. **Contribution to Craftour Coordination.** A detailed report documenting the HEPHAESTUS project's contribution to the meta-initiative, emphasising activated synergies and achieved impacts.

The research may be carried out in Italian and English.

The fellowship is intended to provide the successful candidate with the opportunity to pursue his/her own research while benefiting from the range of expertise at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia.

Who can apply

Prospective candidates are expected to hold a master's degree in LM-76 (Scienze Economiche per l'Ambiente e la Cultura/Cultural Management, Cultural Economics) and scientific-professional curriculum suitable to the development of research activities related to the fellowship.

Ca' Foscari encourages applications from researchers with positive evaluation in all the criteria in individual proposals such as Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar. Researchers having successfully completed Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar funded projects are warmly encouraged to apply.

Duration of contract: 26 months (approximately starting: February 2025).

Stipend: The research fellowship amounts to **23.340,00** *Euros* per year, including taxes and social charges depending on applicant's filing status (cost to Ca' Foscari: € 28.800,00).

Deadline for submission of applications: January 10th 2025, 12 noon (Italian time).

How to apply:

Candidates shall submit:

- 1. The application form;
- 2. A motivation letter (max 1 page) along with their CV in European format, duly dated and signed, both to enclosed as a one single.pdf file (link); a declaration must be appended in the footnote of the curriculum, pursuant to the Italian DPR 445/2000 and subsequent amendments and additions, that the information provided corresponds to the truth. Moreover the candidates have to consent to the use of their personal data for the purposes of this selection procedure pursuant to the Italian Legislative Decree 196/2003 and to the EU Regulations 2016/679;
- 3. The attachments called "obligations and understanding" and "participation and compatibility";
