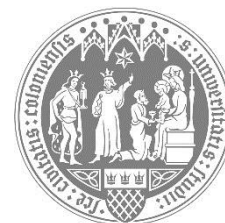

Application Procedure	<p>Admission</p> <p>1) Students have to register online through the portal KLIPS 2.0. (Detailed instructions on the registration procedure are sent by email beforehand).</p> <p>2) After completing the online registration, students need to print out the Application for admission and the Registration form from KLIPS 2.0 and send them (signed and stamped) by email to a.schwarz@verw.uni-koeln.de.</p> <p>Students will be informed by email, as soon as they have been admitted. The Letter of Admission can be printed out from KLIPS 2.0, if needed.</p> <p>Contact person: Annika Schwarz a.schwarz@verw.uni-koeln.de.</p> <p>Enrolment</p> <p>1) After being admitted, students are required to pay the student welfare contribution by bank transfer. <p>Language of Instruction</p>	<p>The main language of instruction at the Faculty of Arts and Humanities is German.</p> <p>A few English taught courses are offered, e.g. in: African Studies, Archaeology, Ethnology, Indology, Linguistics & Phonetics, Media & Cultural Studies, Oriental Studies, North American History, and Musicology.</p> <p>The following degree programmes are entirely taught in English: English Studies (BA, MA), North American Studies (MA), and African Culture and Environment (MA).</p>
<p>Information about ECTS System</p>	<p>All study programmes at the University of Cologne are structured into modules. A module is a teaching unit consisting of several co-requisite courses (e.g. 1 lecture + 1 seminar + 1 tutorial that must be taken together) and one final examination (e.g. a written exam, an oral exam or an essay). Depending on the module's workload, students are awarded either 6, 9 or 12 credit points. Larger modules spreading over two semesters can be allocated 15 or 20 ECTS credits.</p> <p>In case exchange students want to study only a selected course of a given module, i.e. not the whole teaching unit, they need to arrange the amount of ECTS credits and the type of examination individually with the lecturer.</p> <p>Here is a non-binding overview of how many ECTS credits lecturers tend to award, if students do not study the complete module:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lectures with attendance only or short online test (usually not graded): 2 ECTS • Seminar/Übung with oral presentation/exam: 2-4 ECTS • Seminar/Übung with term paper/essay: 4-6 ECTS
