Language requirements English language:	Applicants who plan to participate in no other than courses with English as language of instruction are required to prove their language skills by: TOEFL: minimum 80, IELTS: minimum 6.0
Special language and math requirements School of Business and Economics:	For Undergraduate students interested in studying at the School of Business and Economics it is absolutely vital to have a good command of German language (min. score of 61 points in the C-Test or equivalent proof of B2 level). On-campus accommodation:	Not available
Off-campus accommodation (if on-campus accommodation is not available for exchange students):	Accommodation in student housing: Halls of residence (<i>Wohnheime</i>) are located in various parts of the city and vary in standard and price from € 250 to €500 per month. If the students cannot be accommodated in one of the dormitories they should plan around 500€ per month for rental costs. Food / meals:	Students spend approximately € 200 to € 300 per month on food.
Health insurance:	All students are required to provide proof of health insurance



	<p>coverage when matriculating. Every student on a course up to the 14th semester or up to the age of 30 is entitled to obtain health insurance coverage from one of the recognised mandatory health insurance providers in Germany at a special student rate. The current premium for health and nursing care is around about € 110 per month. Health insurance premiums rise moderately at regular intervals and vary between the different insurance providers. If a student has private health insurance coverage, a German mandatory insurance company may grant exemption from compulsory insurance coverage in Germany. Humboldt-Universität cooperates with recognised mandatory health insurance providers, i.e. AOK, DAK, Barmer and TK, which maintain special points of contact for students and are normally available when new students are matriculating.</p>
Other administration fees:	Enrolment fees approx. €270.00
Books, course materials, and stationeries:	Approximately € 25.00/ month
Local transportation:	These costs are included in the enrolment fee, covering for the student semester ticket which is integrated into the student ID.
