Application Materials	<p>Please send the following documents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scanned copies of academic transcripts (in English) • Copy of English proficiency scores (for applicants who are not native speakers of English)
English Proficiency (if applicable)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Letter from home university confirming proficiency. • TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) with a minimum score of 60 points from TOEFL iBT / TOEFL iBT Home Edition or 500 points from TOEFL PBT. • IELTS (International English Language Testing Service) Academic test / Online academic test with a minimum score of 5.0 <p>See other options here: https://oslonyehoyskole.no/english/how-apply-oslo-nye-hoyskole</p>
Study Permit	<p>Non-EU national: If you come from a country outside the EU/EEA/Switzerland and wish to study in Norway, you must apply for a study permit. This also applies to UK citizens. You must meet certain criteria to obtain a study permit, for example proof of admission, housing, and funding. Read more about the requirements, and your rights and obligations once granted a study permit at UDI.no</p> <p>EU-national: If you come from the EU/EEA or Switzerland, you must register with the local police within three months of your arrival. Read more about how to register and the conditions that apply at UDI.no. (external link)</p>
Health Services	<p>ONH works with the Student Welfare Organization in Oslo (SiO) who offers all students access to doctor appointments, mental health and counselling and discounts to the dentist. Read more about SiO's health services here.</p>
Health Insurance	<p>All study abroad and exchange students are responsible for buying their own insurance.</p>
Accommodation	<p>ONH works with the Student Welfare Organization in Oslo (SiO) and Anker Student Housing who both offer different types of accommodation around the city of Oslo.</p> <p>ONH will assist students with reserving accommodation, but can not guarantee a room with our partners.</p> <p>Nominations must be in before 20 April for ONH to assist with reserving accommodation. Accepted students must not delay in applying for housing.</p>
Course Registration	<p>Students should notify ONH at international@oslonh.no or ane@oslonh.no of what courses they wish to take. They can change courses during the first week of the semester. They are guaranteed a spot in the class, but please note that some courses might not run if there are not enough registered students for the course.</p>

N.B. Students must have registered at least 60 credits when submitting the application to the host university
