Dates

Undergraduate term dates (incl. exams);

There are four terms of approx. three months each. Each term has 8- 10 weeks of classes, exams take place during the last week of each term.

Inbound students may stay for one or two terms. Usually, they stay for two terms (=one semester). Three or four terms may be arranged by prior agreement.

- Term 1: early October – mid/ late December
- Term 2: early January – end of March
- Term 3: early April – June
- Term 4: late July – end of September/early October

Induction week/day

There is an official induction week for students starting in Term 1 and 2. There are 2 induction days prior to the start of Terms 3 and 4.

Application documents	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Application form • Learning agreement (you may use either the HSBA form or your university's) • Transcript of Records • Passport sized photograph (electronic passport sized photograph as a JPG file with 72 dpi) • Passport copy • Proof of English and/or German proficiency at B2 level • CV (postgraduate applicants only) <p>The link to the application form will be sent to students after nomination.</p>
Language proficiency requirements	<p>Proof of English and/or German proficiency at B2 level according to the European Framework of Reference (required from ALL students except native speakers).</p> <p>As proof of English proficiency, we accept: TOEFL iBT (90 pts), IELTS (6.0), Cambridge Certificates: FCE with Grade A, CAE with Grade A, B or C, CPE with Grade A, B, or C, OR equivalent academic tutor's statement of competence in English. A telephone interview may take place.</p> <p>As proof of German proficiency, we accept: DSH-Test (DSH2 level), TestDaF (TDN 4 or higher), Goethe-Zertifikat C2: Großes Deutsches Sprachdiplom (GDS) OR equivalent academic tutor's statement of competence in German. Other certificates on request. A telephone interview may take place.</p>
Credits	<p>Credits: We recommend no more than 15 ECTS per term (30 ECTS per semester) to avoid course overlapping and a high workload.</p>
Number of workload per credit/unit	<p>1 ECTS = ~25-30 hrs of workload (incl. individual preparation, exams)</p>
Transcript of records	<p>A Transcript of records will be issued no later than 8 weeks after the assessment period has finished.</p>
Language of instruction	<p>English/German</p>

<p>German language course offered to exchange students</p>	<p>At HSBA: Beginner's course (A1.2) for 20 weeks starting in October (until March).</p> <p>20% discount for HSBA exchange students at a nearby language school. Visit www.colon.de for more information on the school.</p>
<p>Internships at postgraduate level</p>	<p>The postgraduate programmes run part-time. This allows time to work at the same time as studying.</p> <p>Students must plan, organise and conduct their internships independently.</p> <p>Searching and applying for internships must be done well in advance of the semester.</p>
<p>Accommodation close to HSBA</p>	<p>No HSBA on-site student residences.</p> <p>Advice available in the International Student Guide.</p>
<p>Accommodation for visiting staff close to HSBA (recommended hotels)</p>	<p>No HSBA hall of residences. Advice available online.</p>
<p>Estimated living expenses (per month)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • rent: very much depends on your demands.
