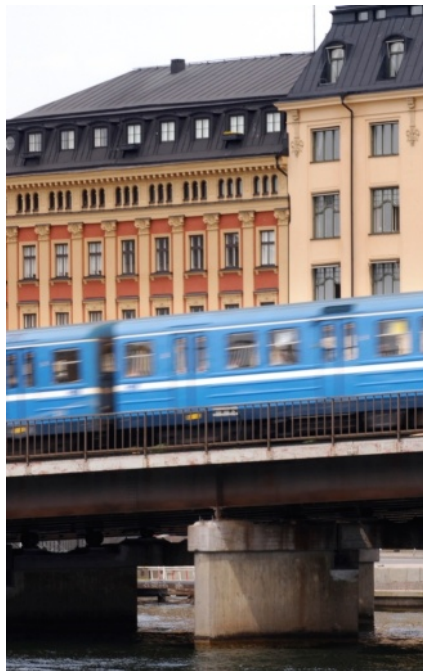


Why Stockholm University?

Insurance

All incoming students are covered by the Swedish State Insurance for Foreign Students in Sweden. The insurance applies during the education period, as well as two weeks prior to the start of studies and two weeks after the end of studies. The insurance applies twenty-four hours a day in Sweden.



Course selection

In March/April, you will receive information about course applications. You will also receive a list of courses to choose from. One full semester of studies equals 30 credits and usually consists of four 7,5 credit courses. Some courses are 15 credits. You can only choose courses within the Department of Asian and Middle Eastern Studies.

Select courses in accordance with the regulations of your home university and return the application to exchange.asia@su.se.

In addition to the 30 credits you can also study Swedish for International Students. You will receive more information about this in April together with the complete list of courses.
