

# FACULTY OF SCIENCES

**Université Paris Cité** is divided into three Faculties (Humanities and Social Sciences, Health, and Sciences) and one Institute (Institut de Physique du Globe de Paris). Each Faculty is divided into several departments (UFR, IUT, École d'Ingénieur, etc.).

Our departments are located on two main campuses: Grands Moulins and Saint-Germain-des-Prés.

Application step by step	STEP 1: NOMINATION					
	Selected students must be <b>officially nominated</b> by the international relations office of their home university, by sending an email to the departments (contact emails below); nominations made by students themselves will not be accepted. Nominations must include the following information:					
	<ul> <li>LAST NAME</li> <li>First name</li> <li>Date of birth</li> <li>Email address</li> <li>Department at Université Paris Cité</li> <li>Level of study during the mobility</li> <li>Starting semester (first or second according to our calendar)</li> <li>Length of mobility (one semester or an entire year)</li> </ul>					
	<ul> <li>Once nominated, students will receive an "application kit" with the following items:</li> <li>Guidelines (MoveON platform application link, instructions)</li> <li>Learning agreement templates (Erasmus and non-Erasmus)</li> <li>Agenda and mobility contacts</li> </ul>					
	The entire application process is <b>digital</b> . Students must submit their MoveON application form with all the required documents online by the deadline indicated above. Students will have to include in their application a learning agreement approved and signed by their academic contacts at Université Paris Cité and in their home university.					
	Students must indicate a valid e-mail address in the form (avoid Hotmail, live, qq.com and 163.com accounts).

**IMPORTANT**: The recommended level of language varies depending on the course and the language in which it is taught. For your information, we recommend at least B2 English for English-taught lectures and B2 French for French-taught lectures. The student's language level must be approved by the academic contact at Université Paris Cité before registering to a specific course.

IV. GENERAL INFORMATION				
Housing	UNIVERSITY STUDENT HOUSING			
	Université Paris Cité only has a few rooms in several residences in Paris (also called CROUS). Therefore, <b>we</b> cannot guarantee housing for all students.			
	Accommodations in CROUS residences are equipped with a kitchenette, bathroom facilities and Internet access. All students staying at a CROUS residence will be eligible for financial housing aid provided by the French state.			
	While applying after their nomination, students will have the option to ask for accommodation provided by Université Paris Cité. A commission will review the applications and decide about housing placements (by the end of June for the 1st semester/by December for the 2 <sup>nd</sup> semester). A housing form will be sent to selected students and will have to be submitted by the deadline to confirm housing.

	OTHER HOUSING POSSIBILITIES

	We recommend being wary of other platforms, as often many of the listings featured are frauds. Beware of any accommodation listing that asks for an upfront deposit through Western Union.

Visa application	VISA			
	All visa applications and paperwork should be handled with the French Consulate or the Campus France centre of your country before arriving in France. Information on student visa: <u>https://france-visas.gouv.fr/en/web/france-visas/accueil</u> (available in several languages).			
	LIVING COSTS			
	Note that it is very difficult for exchange students to get a part-time job. It is important that students have enough funding to cover the expected cost of their stay in Paris.			
	Rent (€): around €800/month for a studio apartment, around €600/month for a shared flat. These prices apply in Paris; suburban areas tend to be cheaper.			



Transport fares: 86.40€/month for Paris and its suburbs. **PS:** students under 26 can benefit from a discount pass ("<u>Imagine R Étudiant</u>") for 365€/year.

Food (€): around €250/month.

## HEALTH INSURANCE

International students have access to the French national healthcare system.

A complementary insurance is highly recommended.

Specific information on that part will be shared in the Welcome Guide and during the mobility preparation conferences.
