| Language proficiency requirements | Proof of English and/or German proficiency at B2 level according to the European Framework of Reference (required from ALL students except native speakers). As proof of English proficiency, we accept: TOEFL ibT (90 pts), IELTS (6.0), Cambridge Certificates: FCE with Grade A, CAE with Grade A, B or C, CPE with Grade A, B, or C, OR equivalent academic tutor's statement of competence in English. A telephone interview may take place. As proof of German proficiency, we accept: DSH-Test (DSH2 level), TestDaF (TDN 4 or higher), Goethe-Zertifikat C2: Großes Deutsches Sprachdiplom (GDS) OR equivalent academic tutor's statement of competence in German. Other certificates on request. A telephone interview may take place. | | | |
| Credits | Credits: We recommend no more than 15 ECTS per term (30 ECTS per semester) to avoid course overlapping and a high workload. | | | |
