	Please note that admission to HDK-Valand Academy of Arts and Design programmes is highly competitive and depends largely on portfolio work. General requirements	Language: Students should meet a B2 proficiency level in English, coordinator guarantee this level of proficiency by nomination. Official test results are not required.
	Academics Ba : Incoming students on bachelor/BA-level/first cycle need to have completed one full year of studies at home university when starting their exchange at GU.
	Academics Ma : Incoming students on master-level need to have completed one semester of studies at home university.
Step 3 – Housing application	Information on housing will be sent to the student by the receiving faculty/department at GU.

Step 4 – Course application	Information on choosing courses will be sent to the student by the receiving faculty/department at GU.

	Please note that it is not possible to change courses after the course application deadline has passed. GU <u>does not have</u> an add/drop week. Students need to review and choose courses carefully. We strongly recommend students to go through GU's course offerings before applying to the home university for exchange studies. Should students not meet the requirements for their chosen courses, they will be given the chance to choose other courses within the same faculty. Please note that restrictions apply to certain study fields, and that course spaces are limited. Students first choices of courses cannot therefore be quaranteed.
Step 5 – Screening procedure	Applications are screened and processed by the receiving faculty/department.
Step 6 – Acceptance Letter / Learning Agreement	The receiving faculty/department will send the student information about the status of their application (for example, if relevant, acceptance letters, sign your learning agreements, etc).

Studying shorter than three months?	Students will need to apply for an entry visa. Please visit https://www.migrationsverket.se/English/Private-individuals/Studying-in-Sweden/Higher-education.html for information on visa requirements and which countries that are exempt.
Studying for three months or longer?	Students must have a valid residence permit for studies included in their passport before they travel to Sweden. Information about residence permits and related matters can be found here . Students should start their application for the residence permit as soon as they receive the acceptance letter via e-mail.



Full time studies, grading and course load	A normal workload (full time studies) for one semester is 30 credits, for full academic year: 60 credits. Courses usually consist of 7.5 credits, 15 credits, or 30 credits each. Courses are generally taken in a modular system which means students take one course at a time with a final exam at the end of each course. Exceptions in some Faculties.
