**It is possible to nominate and apply for Spring Term only, but please keep in mind that this time is reserved for thesis writing and individual consultations. Very few courses are offered, so students might not be able to earn the required amount of ECTS credits.*

Admission after nomination for Erasmus+ studies at CEU is not automatic. Applicants are asked to submit an application package, which is evaluated on the basis of the quality of the application, the applicant's academic strength as well as their knowledge of English.

Teaching at CEU is conducted exclusively in English and classes are discussion-based. Erasmus students are fully integrated with CEU's degree-seeking students who have demonstrated in their applications proficiency of English. For this reason, we expect from Erasmus applicants a command of the English language comparable to that of our degree students (Level B2-C1 in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages - CEFRL).

CEU offers over 800 courses taught in English. Erasmus + students need to take at least 50% of their courses (or ECTS credits) at their host department at CEU and are free to take the remaining 50% from any other department that offers courses related to the student's current studies.

CEU uses a system of letter grades and grade points for evaluating student work. The lowest passing grade is C+. At the end of each course, course instructors distribute a detailed breakdown of the course grade components.

Standardized English language test scores (TOEFL, IELTS, Cambridge etc.) or a certificate issued by the home institution confirming the level of the language in CEFRL. Students speaking English as a native language or who have earned a Bachelor's or a Master's degree taught exclusively in English are exempted from this requirement.

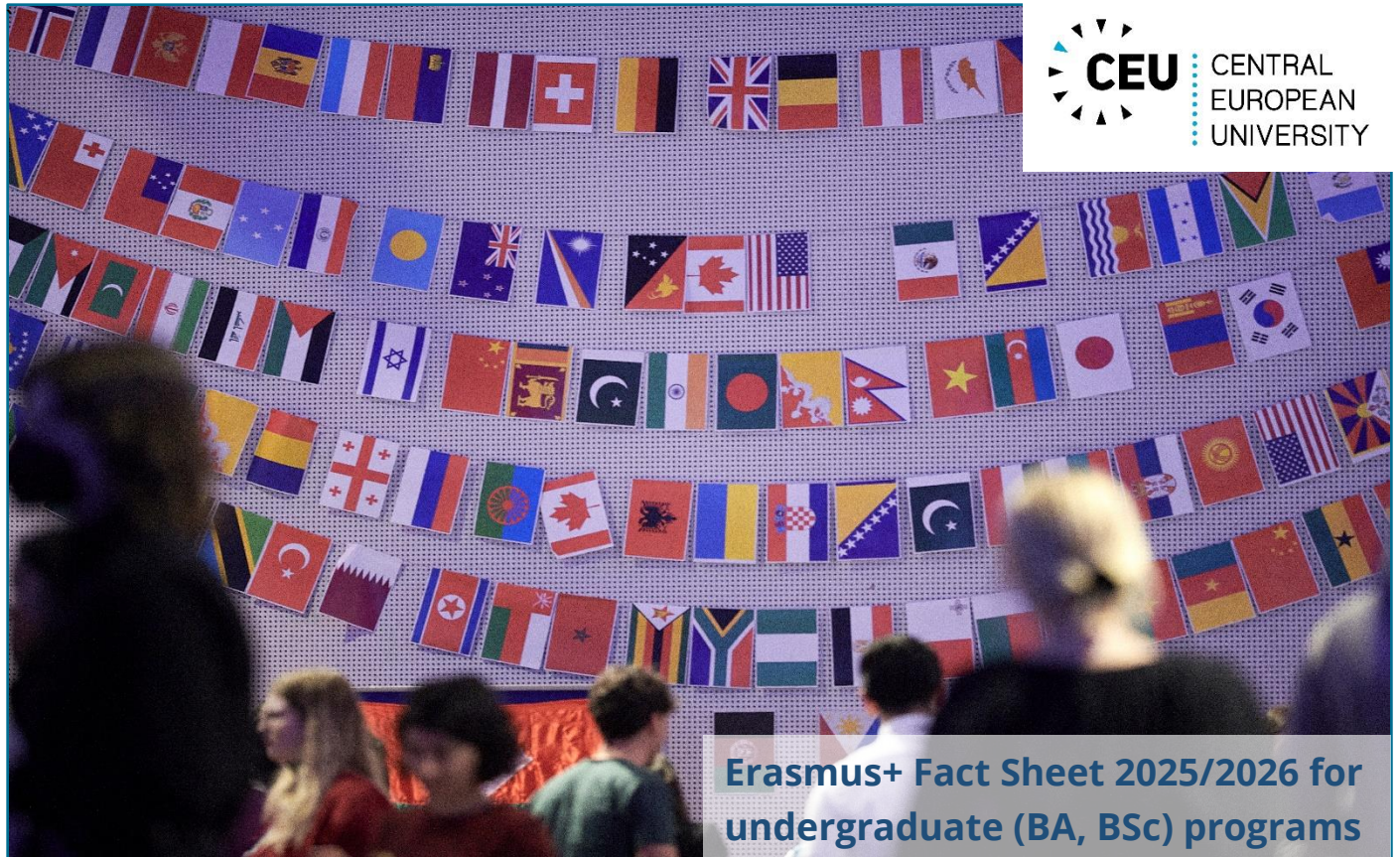
