Students need to review and choose courses carefully. We strongly recommend students to go through GU's course offerings before applying to the home university for exchange studies.
	Should students not meet the requirements for their chosen courses, they will be given the chance to choose other courses within the same faculty. Please note that restrictions apply to certain study fields, and that course spaces are limited. Students first choices of courses cannot therefore be guaranteed.
Step 5 – Screening procedure	Applications are screened and processed by the receiving faculty/department.
Step 6 – Acceptance Letter / Learning Agreement	The receiving faculty/department will send the student information about the status of their application (for example, if relevant, acceptance letters, sign your learning agreements, etc).

Students should start their application for the residence permit as soon as they receive the acceptance letter via e-mail.
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Academic information	
Full time studies, grading and course load	A normal workload (full time studies) for one semester is 30 credits, for full academic year: 60 credits. Courses usually consist of 7.5 credits, 15 credits, or 30 credits each. Courses are generally taken in a modular system which means students take one course at a time with a final exam at the end of each course. Exceptions in some Faculties.
