<p>Application procedure</p>	<p>Step 1: official nomination by the home university to incoming@sciencespo-saintgermain.fr</p> <p>Step 2: nominated students are e-mailed an application form to complete and the list of supporting documents to submit :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - last university grades - proof of a B2 level in French or English - passport copy - ID photo (for the student card) <p>Step 3: upon reception of the complete application, the International Office emails the student his/her Acceptance letter and information to prepare the exchange.</p>
<p>Language Pre requisites</p>	<p>Non-French and non-English native-speakers will need to provide a language certificate showing a B2 or higher level in French or in English as defined in the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference) – Accepted certificate in French : DELF, DALF, TCF, CEFP / in English : TOEFL iBT 72 minimum, IELTS 6 minimum</p>
<p>Language support</p>	<p>French as a foreign language is offered, all year long, free of charge for 3 different levels: beginner, intermediate, advanced (up to 55 hours per semester, twice a week).</p>
<p>Courses</p>	<p>Main language of instruction is French but there is a wide variety of courses also available in English in the main subjects: Political Science, International Relations, Law, Economics, Sociology and History.</p> <p>Some lectures are specifically designed for international students.</p> <p>Be aware that classes at Master’s level are held only from September to February.</p> <p>Course catalogue: https://www.sciencespo-saintgermainenlaye.fr/en/courses/</p>

Visa	<p>Citizens from EU/EEA countries do not need a visa to enter France.</p> <p>All other nationalities must check if they need a visa on: https://france-visas.gouv.fr/en/web/france-visas/visa-wizard</p>
Estimated cost of living	800 € - 1000 € per month
Accommodation	<p>The international relations team provides support and guidance to students finding a suitable place in the area, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - studios or shared rooms in private student halls - accommodation in families with an international background
Airport pick-up service	Free of charge upon registration from non-European countries, on specified week days before the orientation.
Health insurance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - EU/EEA nationals should apply and obtain the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) for reduced cost or free medical treatment - All non-European students should enroll in the French national health insurance (free of charge): https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr
Student life	<p>All exchange students are provided the same access to campus facilities as local students (library, social and cultural events, sports...).</p> <p>Incoming students are placed in contact with student associations and assigned a "Buddy" who supports them during their arrival and stay.</p>
