Information packs

- Starter Pack (by end of May for TI & AA, by the end of October for the T2): exchange at glance, VISA and Acceptance letters, and MoveOn application form web link e-mailed to the students once they have been officially announced.
- **Before you come Pack** (by June for TI & AA, by December for T2): visa letter, guide 1... sent by email once the students have completed the application form on-line MoveOn.
- Finalisation registration with the matricule number and process to create ULB email address sent by email once the MoveOn application approved.
- Welcome Pack: course registration form, guide, goodies ... given on site to the students during the Welcome meeting.

Academic calendar

• Autumn semester - 1st Term (T1) & AA:

2nd week of September: Welcome week - mandatory
(Welcome meeting, Academic coordinators' meeting)
Mid-September: start of courses
Mid-December: end of course
Early January: exam session
3rd week of January: end of exchange

• Spring semester - 2nd Term (T2) & AA:

Last week of January: Welcome week - mandatory

(Welcome meeting, Academic coordinators' meeting)
Beginning of February: start of courses
End of May to end of June: exam session
End of June: end of the exchange

Nomination

- Process: exchange students' nominations have to be sent by the home university coordinator by email to pipsin@ulb.be. Please use the <u>Phisoc nomination form in</u> <u>the Excel format</u> (last and first names,, gender, e-mail address, year of study, exchange period, major at ULB).
- Deadlines:

1st term & academic year: MAY 15th 2nd term: OCTOBER 15th

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Agreements

Application

- **Process:** exchange students have to fill in the <u>MoveOn</u> application form.
- **Deadlines:** within 2 weeks of receiving the **Starter pack** by email.

Language requirement

• No language certificate (DALF/DELF/etc.) is required.

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- However, ULB is a French-taught university, which means that exchange students must acquire a **B1 level** in French prior to their arrival.
- French courses: ULB offers free French courses <u>30-hour module</u> (3 credits) or <u>60-hour module</u> (5 credits) at the ULB Language Unit.

Courses

- **Process**: exchange students must take <u>at least 60% in the study field to which you belong</u> (e.g. Political science) <u>in our faculty</u>. They are allowed to choose the remainder (40%) <u>in other study fields or departments or faculties</u> (e.g. a maximum of 40% of your courses in Social Sciences or Law), If they are willing to, Bachelor exchange students are able to choose and/or up to 2 Master's courses if they have the approval of the Professors. They must submit their final courses with official form (Learning Agreement and pink form).
- **Deadline**: exchange students have the opportunity to attend courses during <u>+/- 3 weeks after the start of classes.</u>

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	Exams	 Exchange students will take their exams in the same conditions as regular students. They are NOT authorized to organize their exams individually with their professors. All students are expected to take their exams during the official exams periods: January: exams for the 1st term courses May –June: exams for AA and 2nd term courses Mid-August – beginning of September: re-sit exams for the 1st and 2nd term courses Should exchange students want to pass re-sit exams, they must come back to Brussels.
	Results	 Process: the official transcript of records is downloadable directly on their intranet (MonULB) once all the records are published. Deadlines: 1st term: in the course of February 2nd term and AA: in the course of July Re-sit exams session: by the end of September
