
UiT offers education at eleven study sites across Northern Norway.

Erasmus+ students	Must meet course requirements and select the majority of courses within their subject field and the host Erasmus+ department at UiT.	
Non-Erasmus+ students	Must meet course requirements and select the majority of courses within their subject field/degree.	
Project/Scholarship-based students	The student or nominator must contact the relevant Project Coordinator at UiT or the home university to identify suitable courses.	
Course workload	 Standard workload: 30 ECTS per semester. Maximum workload: Up to 60 ECTS per semester if they meet the admission requirements for each course. 	
Course Levels	Bachelor's level: Course codes 1XXX – 2XXX Master's level courses: Course codes 3XXX – 4XXX Note: Master's level courses are only open to students who hold a bachelor's degree.	
Campus and course selection	Students may only select courses from one campus (city) per semester. It is not possible to mix courses from different campuses in the same semester.

Traineeship / internship / placement students

UiT welcomes applications for traineeships (e.g. practical placements, internships, lab work, or research related to thesis supervision) from:

- Students from partner institutions
- Guest students from Erasmus+ institutions in Europe only

Duration requirements:

- Minimum: 2 months
- Maximum: 1 academic year per study cycle (BA, MA, or PhD), even if the semesters are non-contiguous

FOR TRAINEESHIPS IN PROFESSIONAL HEALTH SCIENCES

Applications for practical placements, clinical rotations, or traineeships in fields such as medicine, dentistry, nursing, midwifery, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, radiography, paramedicine, and bioengineering are only accepted from students nominated by UiT's partner universities.

Traineeship Guidelines

We strongly advise the nominator at the partner institution or the student to contact the partner department at UiT directly to confirm whether they can host traineeship students before the nomination.
