Application procedure	
Step 1 – Nomination	Exchange students must be officially nominated by their home university. Nominations are accepted via a nomination sheet which will be emailed separately at the start of the nomination period.
Nomination deadlines	Fall semester or academic year: 1 April Spring semester: 1 October

<p>Step 2 – Online application & Required documents</p>	<p>All incoming exchange students apply online via our application portal and submit digital documentation. No hard copies are required. Nominated students will receive application instructions via e-mail at the beginning of the application period. Information about the application can also be found here.</p> <p>The following documents are required for all students:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Official Transcript of Records in English showing all completed semesters together with a Certificate of Registration/screenshot of student registry showing all currently enrolled courses (please both in one PDF-file) 2. Copy of Passport <p><i>Please note that students applying for HDK-Valand Academy of Arts and Design will receive separate application instructions upon nomination and will need to submit portfolio work.</i></p>

<p>Application deadlines for the Faculty of Fine, Applied and Performing Arts</p>	<p>Fall semester/Full academic year: 1 April</p> <p>Spring semester 15 October (HDK-Valand Academy of Arts and Design) 15 November (Academy of Music and Drama)</p> <p>Please note that admission to HDK-Valand Academy of Arts and Design programmes is highly competitive and depends largely on portfolio work. Students who are accepted are required to follow a set track for the term/academic year. General requirements	<p>Language: Students should meet a B2 proficiency level in English, official test results are not required.</p> <p>Incoming students on bachelor/BA-level/first cycle need to have completed one full year of studies at home university when starting their exchange at GU.</p> <p>Incoming students on master-level need to have completed one semester of studies at home university.</p>
Step 3 – Housing application	<p>Students who wish to apply for housing via GU need to tick the housing-box in the online application. Instructions on how to apply for housing will be sent out via e-mail <u>after</u> the online application deadline has passed. In this e-mail each student will receive a personal code to be used in the housing application.</p> <p>More information on housing and application here: https://www.gu.se/en/study-in-gothenburg/when-you-are-here/student-housing </p>
Step 4 – Course application	<p>Students will need to indicate the courses they wish to take in the online application. In addition to this, students should upload a separate “Course Wish List” (which they will receive via email along with the application instructions) by the latest 1 May for fall semester/academic year and 1 November for spring semester.</p> <p>Available courses for exchange students can be found here: https://www.gu.se/en/study-in-gothenburg/exchange-student/courses-for-exchange-students </p> <p>Please note that there is no possibility of changing courses after the course application deadline has passed. GU <u>does not have</u> an add/drop week. Students need therefore to choose courses carefully and follow the instructions before submitting the “Course Wish List”.</p>
Step 5 – Screening procedure	<p>Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis after 1 April/1 October. The course wish lists are sent after 1 May/ 1 November for evaluation to the respective departments.</p>
Step 6 – Acceptance Letter	<p>Acceptance Letters are sent out on a rolling basis after 1 April/1 October.</p> <p>Acceptance Letters will only be sent as digital copies by e-mail to the student and the International Coordinator. No original hard copies will be sent since the digital copy is enough for the visa application.</p>

Studying for three months or longer?	Students must have a valid residence permit for studies included in their passport before they travel to Sweden. Information about residence permits and related matters can be found here . Students should start their application for the residence permit as soon as they receive the acceptance letter via e-mail.

Academic information

Full time studies, grading and course load	A normal workload (full time studies) for one semester is 30 credits, for full academic year: 60 credits. Courses usually consist of 7.5 credits, 15 credits, or 30 credits each. Courses are taken in a modular system which means students generally take one course at a time with a final exam at the end of each course. Language of instruction	English (courses open for exchange students). Students should always check the different courses' prerequisites. Students can also be eligible for courses taught in Swedish if those are open for exchange students.
