B1 level is also a minimum recommended (B2 advised) for classes taught in English. In addition, all students enrolled in the program benefit from Business English and Business Spanish. French as a foreign language is elective.

French grading system

The French grading system is based mostly on a 20-point grading scale:

- 16–20: very good (*très bien*: TB)
- 14–15.9: good (*bien*: B)
- 12–13.9: satisfactory (*assez bien*: AB)
- 10–11.9: correct (*passable*)
- 0–9.9: fail (*insuffisant*)

Nomination clauses

1. Applications/information on nominated students must reach the receiving institution by: 30 November (Spring term) / 31 May (Fall term)
2. The receiving institution will send its decision within [x] weeks.
3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than [xx] weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. *[It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]*
4. Termination of the agreement: *It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."*
