

THE COMPLEXITY OF ORAL TRADITIONS, WITH A HIMALAYAN EXAMPLE

Abstract

It has sometimes been claimed that there is a fundamental difference between speech and writing as modes of communication, with sophisticated and logical thinking a result of the technology of writing. This talk will review these arguments and the major counter-arguments to them. The issues involved will be illustrated with the rich and complex oral traditions practiced, and theorized, in the Himalayan region of Kumaon in northern India.

Nota biografica

John Leavitt teaches in the Department of anthropology at the Université de Montréal, specializing in linguistic anthropology. He has conducted field research in the Central Himalayan region of northern India and in Ireland and has published on oral traditions, comparative mythology, and language diversity. He has edited the volumes *Poetry and Prophecy: The Anthropology of Inspiration* (1997) and *Le mythe aujourd'hui* (2005) and is the author of *Linguistic Relativities: Language Diversity and Modern Thought* (2011).
