

Dr. Carol Berger Beads, Bullets, and Rosaries: Venice and Late Pre-colonial This lecture examines the history of contact between northern Italy, particularly Venice, and late pre-colonial Sudan. This contact included priests and nuns who traveled from northern Italy to Sudan as part of the 19thcentury missionary movement. Pre-dating the arrival of the Catholic missionaries, Mediterranean trade to north Africa brought simple goods, including Venetian glass beads, and weapons from the armaments production center of Brescia. It is noted that Venetian trade networks, with agents operating out of the Egyptian cities of Alexandria and Cairo, are well documented from the Medieval period.
